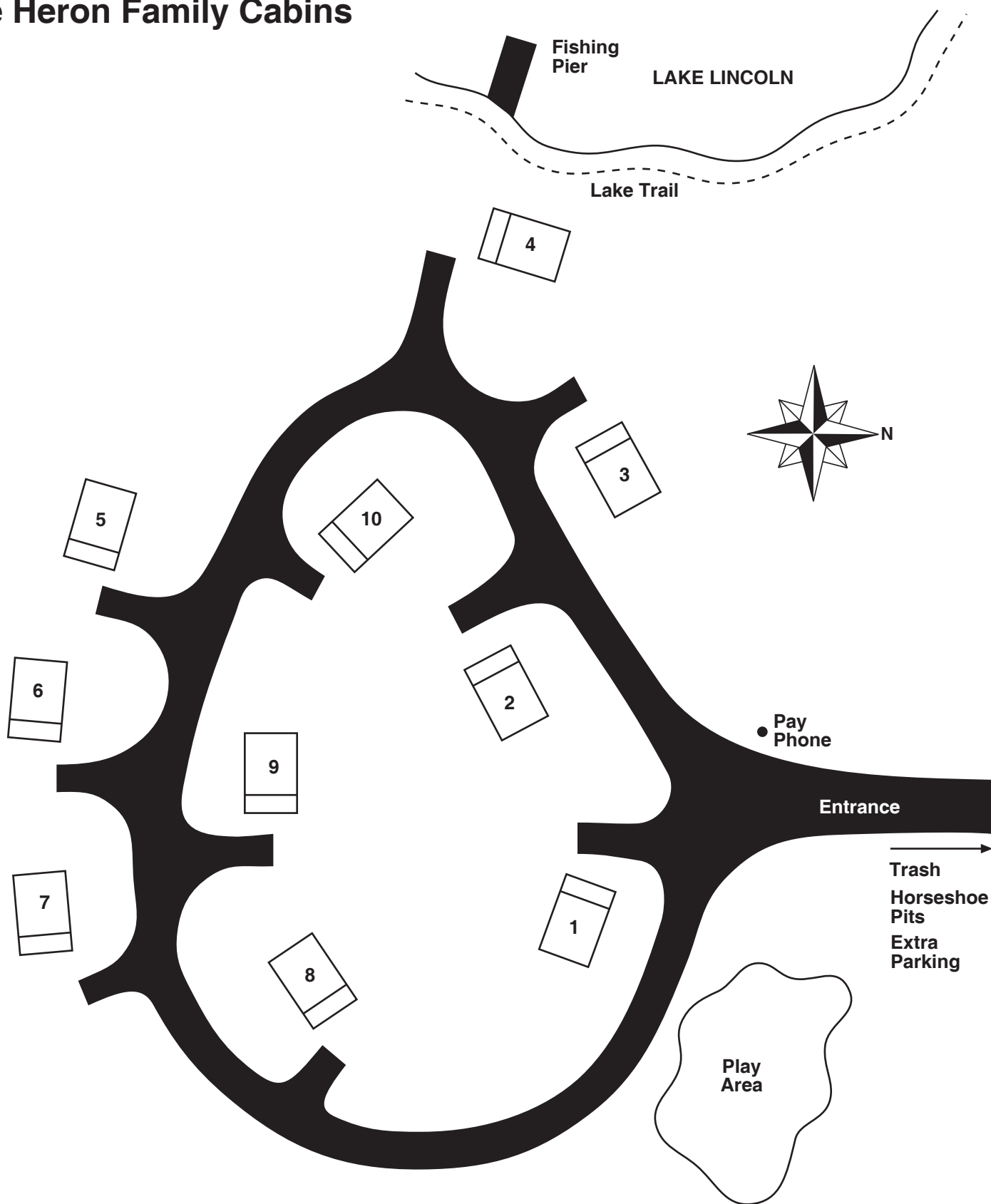


# LINCOLN STATE PARK

## Blue Heron Family Cabins



- Each cabin has a stationary picnic table, fire ring and grill.
- An adult, 21 years-old or older must be on the premise at all times. **This rule will be enforced.**
- All cabins are **non-smoking**.

## Public Policies and Procedures for Blue Heron Family Cabins

- Must be twenty-one to rent cabin and be an occupant of cabin during stay.
- PETS ARE PROHIBITED in the cabins and surrounding areas. Failure to abide by this regulation will result in cleaning charges and eviction from each cabin.
- No outside ground fires are permitted in the Family Cabin area, outside fires must be in fire ring only.
- On state park properties the collection of firewood is prohibited.
- In cabin area 2 vehicles shall be allowed per cabin. All other vehicles should be parked in overflow lot.
- Tents, pop-ups, or campers are not permitted in the family cabin area.
- Cabin occupancy is limited to a period not to exceed 14 consecutive nights. At the end of any camping period, the camping group must completely vacate the property with all equipment, for a minimum of 48 hours.
- All applicable entrance fees are required upon entering the property.
- The cabin hangtag must be retained in the vehicle as a pass through the main gate and campground gate. Only those vehicles with valid receipts are permitted to enter. All visitors to a cabin must park in a designated area.
- Quiet hours shall be observed from 11 p.m. to 7 a.m (local time).
- Check- in time is 4:00 p.m.and check-out time is 11:00 a.m. Check-out time is strictly enforced
- Leasing or subleasing cabins is prohibited.
- Each cabin may be occupied by up to the maximum capacity only.
- It is expected that occupants will maintain the facilities in a satisfactory condition and leave the cabin in a condition suitable for the next occupant.
- All firearms (except validly license handguns), BB guns, bows, CO2 guns, or spear guns must be unloaded or unstrung and stored in a case or locked vehicle when using campgrounds on Department of Natural Resources properties.
- All refuse and garbage is to be placed in receptacles provided for that purpose.
- It shall be unlawful to possess fireworks
- The washing of dishes at drinking fountains, lavatories, or laundry tubs is prohibited. Dishwater must be disposed of through proper sanitary facilities: it must not be discharged on or into the ground. The washing of automobiles or boats in the cabin area is prohibited.
- Occupants should ensure that they have all of their personal belongings when they check out. Any property found left in the cabin will be held or stored by the Property Manager, for 30 days. No property may be redeemed until payment by owner of storage and other fees. If property is not redeemed within designated period, it may be disposed of through established policy.
- Cabins are not equipped with telephones; however, park employees will deliver emergency telephone messages.
- Cabin rental does not include provision of boat launch fee.
- Valid hangtag or park receipt will be honored at all DNR properties for waiver of entrance fees.
- Each cabin may be occupied by up to the maximum capacity only. Exception will be made only for occupants who have more than the maximum capacity in their immediate family.
- Cabin reservations are available on line at [camp.in.gov](http://camp.in.gov) or by calling 1-866-622-6746. Local sale may be processed in person at the property; however, reservations may only be made on line or through the call center at the internet address and/or the telephone listed above
- It shall be unlawful to build a fire except in designated public areas, provided by the Department of Natural Resources for that purpose. Fires shall be entirely extinguished immediately after use. Lighted matches, cigarettes, cigars, or other articles afire shall be thoroughly extinguished before being discarded. The Department or its authorized representative may prohibit all fires in any area when deemed necessary for the protection of the property.
- It is unlawful to injure, cut, destroy, remove, mutilate, or deface any building structure, sign, rock, tree, shrub, vine or property whatsoever, or pick any flowers or take or rifle the nest of any bird or den, nest or abode of any wildlife animal or to rock climb or rappel on land subject to regulations in 312-IAC8-2-10.
